

WHAT ARE THE RISKS AND WHAT COULD I GET IN RETURN?

SUMMARY RISK INDICATOR



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because the Issuer is not able to pay you. The Issuer has classified this product as 3 out of 7, which is a medium-low risk class.
